

Fire in Harwood Street

At an early hour this morning Superintendent Pound and the men of the Fire Brigade were called to Harwood street, Highfield, where a fire had broken out on the premises at the back of No. 86 in that street, occupied by Mr. Herbert Glossop, saw manufacturer. On arriving, it was found that the scene of the outbreak was a two-storied building, the lower portion of which was used as a hardening room. Here was a furnace and it was close to the flue that the fire had originated. With a good supply of water directed to the building on one side by the firemen, and on the other by Inspector Bradbury, the fire was soon got under, and fully half of the premises saved from destruction. The hardening shop, however, was burnt out; and a quantity of stock destroyed. The damage will probably be estimated at about £300, and will be covered by insurance.
