

Sheffield Horse Parade A Popular Festival

The fourth annual festival Sheffield Horse Show drew a large attendance to Hillsborough Park this afternoon.

The procession of trade turnouts, which formed the most important feature of the day, started from Fitzwilliam Street at eleven o'clock, and moved by way of the Moor, High Street, and Infirmary Road to the park, attracting many spectators.

Adding distinction to the demonstration, were members of the Fire Brigade with a tender, tender escape and steamer.

Afterwards, under Second-Officer Hadwick, the firemen displayed, in a most attractive fashion, their prowess both at the lake side and in the ring, several methods of life-saving being shown.

The entries numbered 255, and of these 210 were competing in the turnout class. The admission of donkeys was an innovation.

The judges considered the classes to be distinctly better than those of last year.

Prizes were offered amounting to upwards of £200 in value.
